

Occupational English Test (OET) Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

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What is the OET?

The OET is the Occupational English Test. The OET is broken down into four areas: Listening, Reading, Writing and Speaking. It is designed specifically to assess the English Language skills of international healthcare professionals wanting to work in an English-speaking environment.

Which level do I need to achieve in the OET?

The NMC require you to gain a minimum of Level B in speaking, listening, and reading and Level C+ in writing of the test. Please see the score scale below:

What do the OET tests involve?

Test	Content	Time	
Speaking	Specific to your profession, based on typical workplace situations. You will take part in two role-plays , where you'll take your professional role while the other person plays a patient or client, or sometimes a relative or carer.	Approx. 20 minutes	
Writing	Specific to your profession, based on typical workplace situations.	45 minutes	
	The task is to write a letter, usually a referral letter. Sometimes, especially for some professions, a different type of letter is required, i.e. a letter of transfer or discharge, or a letter to advise or inform a patient, carer, or group.		
Listening	3 parts , where you will follow and understand a range of health-related spoken materials such as patient 45 m consultations and lectures.		
Reading	3 parts and a total of 42 question items . The topics are of generic healthcare interest and are therefore accessible to candidates across all professions.	60 minutes	
	 The 3 parts are: Part A – Quick reading task This assesses your ability to locate specific information from four short texts in a quick and efficient manner. Part B – Careful reading task This assesses your ability to identify the detail, gist or main point of six short texts sourced from the healthcare workplace (100-150 words each). Part C – Careful reading task This assesses your ability to identify detailed meaning and opinion in two texts on topics of interest to healthcare professionals (800 words each).

When will I receive my OET results?

Results are issued online approximately 16 business days after the test. Your certificate will be posted to you directly from OET approximately 7 days after the results are published online.



How long are my OET results valid for?

Your OET results are valid for 2 years.

Can I request a re-mark?

You may request a re-mark of your test results. Requests for re-marking must be made within 5 days of results being published.

Can I combine my test certificates?

You can achieve the required mark across two test sittings if:

- You sit the tests within six months of each other, and
- You are tested in all four skills at the same time, and
- All grades in both sittings are above Grade C+ and you achieve Grade B or higher in all four fields when the results of both sittings are viewed together.
